Dear Attorney General Schuette and Director Wyant:

We understand there were some questions raised during the meeting of the Michigan Petroleum Pipeline Task Force regarding the potential future use of Enbridge's Line 5 to carry heavy crude oil. Those questions are similar to one recently posed to Enbridge by the Task Force in a series of follow-up questions to our presentation to the Task Force in September 2014. Specifically, the Task Force asked:

22. Please confirm that no "tar sands" or other heavy crude has been transported through Line 5, and that there are no current plans to convey heavy crude through Line 5.


In response to that question and any related questions raised in yesterday's meeting, Enbridge would like to confirm, for the record, that Line 5 carries light crude oil and natural gas liquids (NGLs) along 645 miles from the Enbridge Terminal in Superior, Wisconsin, across the northern portions of Wisconsin and Michigan to an Enbridge Terminal in Sarnia, Ontario. Line 5 has always been a pipeline whose sole purpose was to transport light products. In the 1980s, natural gas liquids and light synthetic crudes were also moved on the line. Line 5 has never moved heavy Oil Sands crude and we can also confirm that there have never been any prior, current or future plans to move heavy crudes through Line 5.

Enbridge recently expanded the capacity on Line 5 to meet the increasing demand from refineries in Michigan, Ohio, and Ontario for light crude oil produced in the Bakken Region of North Dakota and eastern Montana.
